

Census 2011 Key Statistics Summary Report

1. Introduction

The ONS local authority district level 2011 Census Key Statistics data was released on the 11th of December 2012. The Census data is considered to be the most comprehensive source of information available of the whole population. The Key Statistics tables describe the defining characteristics of the population, who we are, how we live and what we do. The census is unique because it is the only information source that measures these characteristics together across the whole population.

As well as a snapshot of life taken on the 27th of March 2011, the Census also provides a picture of change since 2001, as the majority of 2011 data categories are directly comparable with those produced in 2001.

It should however, be remembered that the results are based on our collective *perceptions* of who we are, how we live and what we do, and these perceptions can differ from reality. As an example in 2011 there are 4,590 households in St.Helens who perceive themselves to be living in a rented Council house, even though all Council stock was transferred to Helena Partnerships in 2002.

Irrespective of this, many aspects of the data as a whole will be vital for informing local leadership and the planning of future service developments.

Key Statistics data at Ward level and below was released on the 30th January 2013. Please refer to the Ward Level Summary Report, now available on our local information system, [info4St.Helens](#). Thereafter further detailed information was released allowing the cross-analysis of data by a number of variables, e.g. age by geography, gender and religious affinity. For the purposes of this report, the Census Key Statistics data sets have been grouped into a number of themes. A narrative summary under each of the themes attempts to draw out some of the key messages and implications from the data. This narrative summary is supported by a number of tables in the appendix showing St Helens data compared to England, the NW and the Liverpool City Region, as well as comparison to 2001 data where appropriate.

This report provides a very quick analysis of the data and does not claim to do justice to the depth and breadth of analysis that could be undertaken at local level. Some of the key messages, such as the comparatively poor perceived health of local residents and high levels of worklessness come as no surprise. Detailed key statistics tables covering data for all local authorities and regions are available from the ONS Census website or can be requested from the Council's Performance Section.

The Council's Local Information System [info4St.Helens](#), provides a series of data tables and additional resources at Borough, Ward and LSOA level. This more detailed data will give a much richer picture of our Borough in 2011 and change over the previous 10 years.

2. Population and Living Arrangements

Census data on population and living arrangements includes details of resident population for males and females, age structure, household numbers and marital status.

- St.Helens population now stands at 175,308. **The Borough has experienced a fall in population of 1,550 people since 2001, a 0.9% decrease.** The Census population estimates are also 2,100 lower than the 2010 mid-year population estimates (-1.2% change). Across the Liverpool City region, Knowsley and Sefton also experienced a fall in population of 3%. Halton, Liverpool, Wigan and Warrington all had significant increases in their population (Table 1a pg 1). **A fall in population will have a negative financial impact on the amount of formula grant received by the Authority.**
- St.Helens has a smaller proportion of people aged 20-29 than the Liverpool City Region, NW and England averages. Conversely **St.Helens has a larger proportion of people 60-74 than the Liverpool City Region, NW and England averages.** This indicates **St.Helens is likely to experience increasing pressure upon adult social care and health services over future years**, at an even greater rate than England as a whole (Table 1b(i) pg 1).
- When compared to 2001 there is now a smaller number of people aged 5-14 (approximately 4,700 less), reflecting the low birth rate in the late 1990s and early 2000s. **Although in recent years the birth rate has risen in St.Helens meaning growing demand for early years services and children and young people's services, such as school places, youth services and children's health services.**(Table 1b(i)/(ii) pg 1 and 2).
- There are a greater proportion of people aged 20-24, 40-49 and 60 and over than in 2001 (Table 1b(i)/(ii) pg 1 and 2). The 60 plus age bracket has increased by approximately 6,400 people between 2001 and 2011. For males there has also been a large increase in the proportion of people aged 70 and over, reflecting improvements in life expectancy (Table 1c (i-iii) pg 3 / 4).
- The Country has seen an increase in the number of households since 2001. This reflects the overall increase in population and the trend for much smaller household units. In St.Helens the number of households has increased by just over 3000 (4.1%) although this is lower than the national and regional average and the third lowest across Merseyside (Table 1a/1a(i) pg 1).
- There has been a growth in the proportion of single residents and a corresponding decrease in the proportion of married residents both in St.Helens and across the Country as a whole (Table 1e / 1e(i) pg 6)

3. Cultural Background

Census data on the Country's cultural background includes details of ethnicity, nationality, language and religion.

- Approximately 97.2% of the population of St.Helens were born in the UK. This is a greater proportion than England as a whole, where approximately 86% of people were born within the UK. The percentage of people born inside the UK in St.Helens is also greater than the percentage born in the UK within the NW and Liverpool City Region. **The proportion of people in St.Helens born within the UK has not changed greatly since 2001**, where the figure stood at 98.1%. Nationally, the population is increasingly diverse. Since 2001 there is a rising proportion of people born abroad (Table 2a / 2a(i) pg 7). In 2011 in St.Helens there is a total of 898 residents from E.U Accessions Countries 2001-11, and 2,490 from Countries outside of the E.U. (EU Accession Countries 2001-11 include, Czech Republic, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Estonia, Hungary, Austria, Finland, Sweden, Malta, Cyprus)

- **St.Helens ethnic group makeup is overwhelmingly 'White', 98.0% of the total population.** This is a much higher percentage than England as a whole (85.5%), and above the NW (90.2%) and Liverpool City Region (94.8%) figures. This has changed marginally from 2001, when 98.8% of the local population classed their ethnic group as 'White' (Table 2b / 2b(i) / 2b(ii) pg 7).
- **The largest ethnic grouping other than 'White' in St.Helens is 'Asian/Asian British',** which accounts for 1.1% of the total population. The largest ethnic populations in St.Helens are Chinese and Indian.
- Nationally there appears to be a fairly significant cultural shift in religious affiliation. Across England as a whole Christianity remains the largest religion, with 59% of the population identifying themselves as Christians. In England approximately 25% of the populace stated that they had no religion. **St.Helens remains a strongly Christian Borough, with 79% of the resident population identifying themselves as Christians. This is the 3rd highest in the Country. Only 14.6% of the population state that they had no religious affiliation.** However, the Borough has followed the national trend by witnessing a growth in residents stating they had no religion and a subsequent reduction in residents declaring themselves as Christians since 2001. In 2001, only 6.3% of St.Helens residents said they had no religion, whilst 86.9% stated that they were Christians (Table 2c / 2c(i) / 2c(ii) pg 9 / 10). The remaining non-Christian religious groupings in St.Helens in 2011 are relatively small. There are a total of 605 Muslims, 416 Hindus and 317 Buddhists.

4. Housing and Households

Census data on the theme of Housing Conditions and Households includes data on housing type, tenure, amenities, occupation levels, households without employment, households with dependents where people are either unemployed or suffer long-term health problems and lone parent households.

- **There are 79,278 Household spaces in St.Helens in 2011, a 5% increase from 2001.** 95.5% of Household spaces are occupied which is approximately on a par with regional and national levels (Table 3a pg 11).
- The relative mix of property types within the Borough remains largely as it was in 2001, albeit with a small increase in the relative percentage of detached properties and flats/apartments and a corresponding decrease in the relative percentage of semi-detached and terraced properties (Table 3a / 3a(i) pg 11). The changes reflect the new build aspirational housing projects undertaken across the Borough, stock clearance of older properties and a trend in RSLs to build smaller housing units.
- The proportion of homes owned with a mortgage or loan between 2001 and 2011 has dropped from 38% to 34% within St Helens. This pattern is mirrored across the NW and the Country as a whole. There has been a corresponding rise in the proportion of homes owned outright (Table 3b pg 12).
- **There has been a reported 3% decrease in the proportion of households which are socially rented in the Borough and a proportionate increase in the private rented sector.** This pattern is mirrored nationally where there has been a greater increase in the private rented sector. The proportion of households privately rented locally places St.Helens in the lowest 10% of all authorities for tenure within this sector (Table 3b pg 12). Although the Authority

has to a large degree limited influence on the private sector, the growth in private rented sector could have implications for the Private Housing Initiatives Team with greater enforcement action. Most of the poorer housing is to be found in the private rented sector and this can be a factor negatively impacting on people's health.

- **There has been a major fall in the number of households in the Borough without central heating**, which currently stands at 2.5% of all households. This compares to 13.3% in 2001. St Helens has the lowest proportion of properties without central heating in the Liverpool City Region and levels below that of the NW and England as a whole (Table 3c /3c(i) pg 12).
- **St.Helens 2011 data shows that there has been an increase in the number and proportion of lone parent households with dependent children.** The numbers of lone parent households with dependent children has increased from 5,766 in 2001 to 6,456 in 2011, a 12% increase. The relative proportion of lone parent households with dependents as a percentage of all households has increased marginally by 0.6%. This increase is mirrored across the NW and England (Table 3d / 3d(i) / 3d(ii) pg 13).
- There has been a small drop in the number and proportion of all pensioner households and single pensioner households between 2001 and 2011, across St.Helens, the NW and England as whole. The reduction is less pronounced in St.Helens (Table 3d / 3d(i) / 3d(ii) pg 13) than at the national and regional level.
- **Just under a third of all households in St.Helens in 2011 reported having one person with a long-term health problem or disability.** This is higher than the proportion for the NW and England as a whole (Table 3e pg 14) and reflects the relatively poor health of the Borough.
- **The proportion of households with dependent children where no adults are in employment (5.5%) is currently marginally higher in St.Helens than in the NW and across England as a whole.** This equates to a total of 4,158 households (Table 3e pg 14). The number and proportion of these households has reduced since 2001, both in St.Helens, as well as across Liverpool City Region, the NW and England as a whole. In 2011 there were a total of 4,158 households with dependents where no adults were in employment (Table 3e pg 14).
- **44% (2,845) of lone parent households are not in employment within St.Helens, a higher proportion than the NW and England as a whole.** In 2001, 55.6% of lone parent families were not in employment within St.Helens, This reduction in lone parent households not in employment and a corresponding increase in lone parent households in part-time and full-time employment has been mirrored across Liverpool City Region, the NW and England as a whole (Table 3f / 3f(i) pg 14/15).

5. Employment and Skills

The Employment and Skills theme includes data on economic activity, hours worked and qualification levels.

- Between 2001 and 2011, in St.Helens there has been a 1% increase in the number of usual residents aged 16-74. In 2011, 66.5% of these residents are classed as economically active, which is below the NW and England respective averages of 67.8% and 69.9%. **The proportion of economically active**

residents has increased between 2001 and 2011. In 2001 the percentage of usual residents aged 16-74 classed as economically active stood at 61.5% (Table 4a / 4a(i) pg 16).

- Equally, the proportion of economically inactive residents has decreased since 2001. Compared with 2001, within the economically inactive group there is now a lesser proportion of residents who are permanently sick or disabled, but higher proportions of students and retired residents within St Helens, the NW and the Country as a whole. A total of 8,638 residents class themselves as permanently sick or disabled and although numbers have fallen over the 10year period, there are still a greater proportion of sick or disabled residents in St.Helens compared to the NW and England. Although student numbers in St.Helens have increased. The proportionate increase in students is more pronounced at the NW and national level, whereas the proportionate increase in retired residents is more pronounced within St.Helens (Table 4b / 4b(i) pg 16).
- In 2011 the Country as a whole saw an increase in the proportion of people working part-time and diminishing numbers working full-time compared to 2001. **This trend is partly mirrored across St.Helens and the Liverpool City Region in that there is an increased proportion of people working part-time, however the proportion of people working full-time has not diminished in St.Helens.** The increase in the proportion of self-employed people since 2001 is more or less consistent across St.Helens and the NW. England as a whole has seen a slightly greater proportionate increase in self-employment (Table 4a / 4a(i) pg 16).
- **Growing economic hardship is reflected in the 2011 Census data. The latest Census data shows an additional 1,324 unemployed residents in St.Helens compared to 2001, bring the total to 6,640.** Increases in unemployment are also visible across the Liverpool City Region, the NW and England as whole. (Table 4a / 4a(i) pg 16).
- Within the Unemployed category of Economically Active residents **there has been increases in the proportion of 16-24 year old unemployed residents, the long-term unemployed and residents who have never worked.** The relative proportion of all 3 groups of unemployed is higher in St.Helens than it is both in the NW and the Country as a whole (Table 4c pg 12). **The proportion of long-term unemployed and 16-24 year old residents as a percentage of the total unemployed is marginally greater in St.Helens than it is across the Liverpool City Region, NW and the Country as a whole** (Table 4c pg 18).
- Nationally, those with a degree or above (i.e. Level 4 and above) outnumber those with no qualifications. This position is reversed in St.Helens and the Liverpool City Region. **Although skill levels have increased between the Census years, St.Helens still has a greater proportion of residents aged 16 plus with no qualifications, and a lesser proportion of residents qualified to Level 4 and above than the Liverpool City Region, NW and England averages.** There are a total of 39,950 usual residents aged 16 plus with no qualifications, approximately 28% of St.Helens' population. Although there has been improvement since 2001, there is still a large core of individuals with no or low skill levels, which have an impact on the Borough's potential for economic growth (Table 4e / 4e(i) pg 19).

6. Industry and Job Type

The Industry and Job Type theme includes data on industry of employment and occupation.

- There are a total of 78,580 residents aged 16-74 in employment in St.Helens, an increase on the 73,076 in 2001. The 4 largest employment sectors within St.Helens are wholesale, retail and vehicle repair (17.5% of the working residents), health and social work (15.6%), manufacturing (10.6%) and public administration (10.5). This pattern is mirrored across the NW and England, although St.Helens has a marginally higher proportion of working residents employed within the manufacturing sector. Although the 2001 and 2011 categories of employment are not directly comparable, the data does demonstrate that **St.Helens employment base is changing. There has been a significant decline in the manufacturing sector, which in 2001 employed 17.5% of the resident population. There has been a corresponding rise in within the public administration, education and health and social work sectors.** (Table 5a pg 20).
- **St.Helens has a smaller proportion of working residents who perceive themselves to be in managerial / professional occupations and a greater proportion of elementary occupations than the NW and England averages.** There are also greater proportions of residents within the caring, leisure and service occupation and process / plant occupation categories in St.Helens compared to the NW and England averages (Table 5b pg 20).

7. Health and Well-being

The Health and Well-being theme includes data on residents' self-reported health, the perceived impact of an individual's health on the undertaking of day to day activities, the provision of unpaid care and residents in communal establishments.

- **12.4% of St Helens residents in 2011 reported that their daily activities were limited a lot by the state of their health. This is equal to the Liverpool City Region average, but above the respective averages of the NW (10.3%) and England as a whole (8.3%).**
23% (40, 262 residents) of the local populace stated that their daily activities were limited a lot or a little by the state of their health. (Table 6a - pg 22).
- **A relatively high proportion of St.Helens residents' perceive their state of health to be bad. 8.3% of residents self-reported their health to be bad or very bad. This is virtually on a par with the Liverpool City Region average (8.2%), but a higher proportion than the average for the NW (6.8%) and England (5.4%).** St.Helens also has a lower proportion of people self-reporting very good or good health (76.7%), compared to the Liverpool City Region (77.5%), NW (79.3%) and England (81.4%). The data confirms what we already know of the comparatively poor health of the Borough and reflects the demographic profile that of an ageing population with greater proportions of manual and unskilled occupations (Table 6b - pg 22).
- **St.Helens has the highest proportion of residents (12.9%) providing unpaid care in the NW and the 4th highest in England.** The average for England is 10.2%. There are now a total 22,591 residents reporting providing unpaid care in the Borough, an increase of 1,072 from 2001. The majority of residents report providing between 1 and 19 hours of unpaid care a week. **It is evident however that there is a greater proportion of carers in St.Helens providing in excess**

of 20 hours plus care a week, compared to the NW and England averages.

The proportion providing 50 plus hours of care a week is very high, approximately 29% of all carers. **St.Helens data also demonstrates that the average carer now provides more care in terms of hours per week than was the case in 2001.** Further Census data to be released over the course of 2013 will give greater insight into the profile of carers across the Borough. (Table 6d/6d(i) - pgs 23/24).

- There are a total of 83 communal establishments in St.Helens, including children's homes, care homes and other care establishments. St.Helens communal establishments support a total of 1,350 usual residents, an increase on the 1178 residents reported in 2001 (Table 6e - pg 23).

8. Transport

The Transport theme currently only includes data on car ownership. Travel to work data is still to be released.

- **Approximately 73% of households within St.Helens have cars or vans, which is approximately 1% below the average for England. More households have cars or vans than they did in 2001, when 69.5% of households reported having vehicles.** There are now a reported 84,445 cars or vans belonging to households within St.Helens, a 14% increase since 2001. In some parts of the Country car ownership levels have reached saturation point. However, in St.Helens car ownership could still be an aspiration for some households and levels of ownership may be set to increase further. The increase in car ownership has a number of implications including greater congestion, pollution, increased pressure on the road network and the need for additional maintenance and increasing demand for parking provision, particularly on street residential parking. (Table 7b / 7b(i) / 7b(ii) - pg 24).
